As Secretary of State, I will pursue a nonpartisan approach to:

1. Dramatically increase voter participation in Indiana across all age, gender, ethnic, religious and secular demographic groups;
2. Establish Election Day as a statewide holiday;
3. End gerrymandering by establishing a nonpartisan citizen's redistricting commission to redraw voting districts to make them fair and competitive to participating political parties;
4. Secure elections using paper ballots;
5. Provide same-day voter registration; facilitate legal voter registration;
6. Expand early voting opportunities; end voter suppression;
7. Pressure lawmakers to pass a hate crime bill; fight against so-called "religious freedom laws" that allow people to discriminate against members of the LGBTQ community;
8. Provide more tax incentives to businesses to make use of solar, wind power and other green energy sources, and for auto dealers to boost sales of hybrid and electric vehicles;
9. Pressure lawmakers to provide student debt relief;
10. Raise the minimum wage to make it at least competitive with Michigan and adjust the state minimum wage annually in according to the rate of inflation; insist on equal pay for equal work;
11. Preserve and promote preventative healthcare initiatives such as free vaccines and yearly wellness exams,
12. Legalize medical marijuana;
13. Provide support for businesses that help young working parents with the cost of child daycare;
14. Pressure lawmakers to provide more support for child welfare agencies because of the opioid drug crisis;
15. Establish a high school educational program on the United States Constitution and on peace education; &
16. Insist on de-escalation training for community police.
